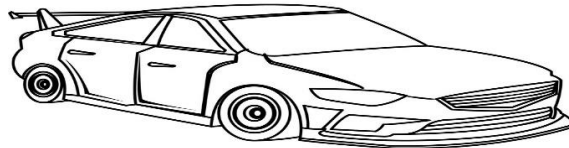
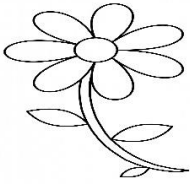
Number lines from 0 to 15.
