- Trace the 'u' using a purple roll up or crayon and there after colour it in light blue. Remember to start at the starting point, hold your rollup using the correct pencil grip and sit in an upright position.

- Ask your mum/dad to read you the story of 'The boy who cried wolf'

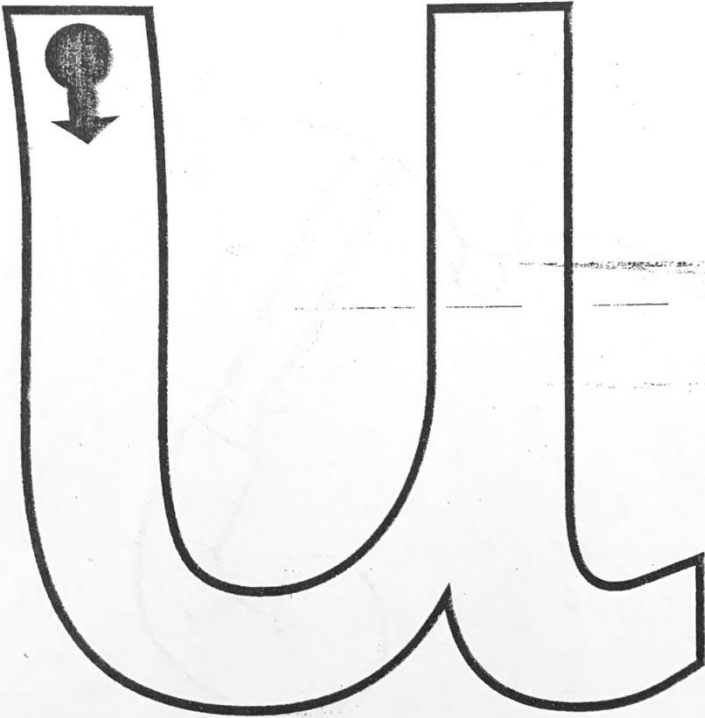
Daily English Orals:
